EXECUTIVE ORDER A-13-100

Relating to Certification of New Heavy-Duty Motor Vehicle Engines

CATERPILLAR, INC.

Pursuant to the authority vested in the Air Resources Board by Sections 43100, 43102 and 43103 of the Health and Safety Code; and

Pursuant to the authority vested in the undersigned by Sections 39515 and 39516 of the Health and Safety Code and Executive Order G-45-9;

IT IS ORDERED AND RESOLVED: That the following 1996 model-year Caterpillar, Inc. diesel-cycle engines are certified for use in motor vehicles with a manufacturer's gross vehicle weight rating (GVWR) over 14,000 pounds:


