EXECUTIVE ORDER A-341-1  
Relating to Certification of New Medium-Duty Motor Vehicle Engines

GENERAL ENGINE PRODUCTS

Pursuant to the authority vested in the Air Resources Board at Sections 43100, 43102, and 43103 of the Health and Safety Code; and

Pursuant to the authority vested in the undersigned at Sections 39515 and 39516 of the Health and Safety Code and Executive Order G-45-9;

IT IS ORDERED AND RESOLVED: That the following 2001 model-year General Engine Products diesel-cycle engines are certified for medium-duty vehicles with a manufacturer's gross vehicle weight rating (GVWR) of 8,501 to 14,000 pounds:

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: That the listed engine models are certified to the optional standards and test procedures applicable to incomplete and diesel medium-duty vehicles of 8,501 to 14,000 pounds GVWR pursuant to Title 13, California Code of Regulations, Section 1956.8 (g).

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: That the listed engine models shall be subject to the in-use compliance provisions applicable to 1995 and subsequent model-year medium-duty vehicle engines set forth in Title 13, California Code of Regulations, Section 2139 (c).

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: That the listed engine models comply with the "Malfunction and Diagnostic System Requirements--1994 and Subsequent Model-Year Passenger Cars, Light-Duty Trucks, and Medium-Duty Vehicles and Engines" (Title 13, California Code of Regulations, Section 1968.1) for the aforementioned model year.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: That for the listed engine models, the manufacturer has submitted the materials to demonstrate certification compliance with the Board's emission control system warranty provisions (Title 13, California Code of Regulations, Sections 2035 et seq.).

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: That the listed engine models comply with the "California Motor Vehicle Emission Control and Smog Index Label Specifications" (Title 13, California Code of Regulations, Section 1965).

Engines certified under this Executive Order must conform to all applicable California emission regulations.
