EXECUTIVE ORDER A-10-588  
Relating to Certification of New Heavy-Duty Motor Vehicles

FORD MOTOR COMPANY

Pursuant to the authority vested in the Air Resources Board by Sections 43100 and 43102 of the Health and Safety Code; and

Pursuant to the authority vested in the undersigned by Sections 39515 and 39516 of the Health and Safety Code Executive Orders G-45-3 and G-45-4;

IT IS ORDERED AND RESOLVED: That Ford Motor Company 1995 model-year motor vehicles which have a manufacturer's gross vehicle weight rating (GVWR) over 14,000 pounds are certified using the Otto-cycle engine listed below:


BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: That, based on the evaporative emission phase-in compliance schedule submitted by the vehicle manufacturer, the listed vehicle models shall not be subject to the running loss and useful life standards set forth in the "California Evaporative Emission Standards and Test Procedures for 1978 and Subsequent Model Motor Vehicles"

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: That the Executive Officer has been provided all material required to demonstrate certification compliance with the Board's emission control system warranty provisions (Title 13, California Code of Regulations, Section 2035 et. seq.).

Engines certified under the Executive Order must conform to all applicable California emission regulations.
