ANNUAL WARRANTY REPORT FORMAT FOR INSTALLERS AND MANUFACTURERS OF DIESEL EMISSION CONTROL STRATEGIES

On August 23, 2012, the Air Resources Board (ARB or Board) approved amendments to the Verification Procedure, Warranty, and In-Use Compliance Requirements for the In-Use Strategies to Control Emissions from Diesel Engines, Title 13, California Code of Regulations, Sections 2700 through 2711 (Procedure). The amendments were approved by the Office of Administrative Law in August 2013 and became effective on October 1, 2013.

These amendments specify that manufacturers and authorized installers of diesel emission control strategies (DECS) must submit annual warranty reports to the Executive Officer. The installation warranty reports are due by March 1 of each calendar year. Authorized installers must provide DECS manufacturers a copy of the information that pertains to the DECS manufacturer's products. The manufacturer warranty reports are due by April 1 of each calendar year. These reports must contain information described in Section 2707(c) and (d) of the Procedure. The consequences of failing to submit the annual warranty report or submitting an incomplete report are described in the same section of the Procedure.

Warranty reports have been required from the DECS manufacturers since the original adoption of the Procedure. The warranty reporting requirements were modified to clarify that all warranty claims must be submitted in the annual report and delineate whether the claims are valid warranty claims or denied claims. To differentiate the claims in the report, the amendments defined the following two terms: newly defined terms called "Valid Warranty Claim" and "Warranty Claim"; these terms seek to differentiate repairs done by manufacturer and installer as a good will gesture versus warranty claims that are rightfully the responsibility of either the installer or device manufacturer. In addition, amendments require that authorized installers are identified in the manufacturer's warranty report.

Previously installers submitted their warranty reports to the manufacturer; the adopted amendments require that installers submit an installation warranty report to ARB. The

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installation warranty report follows the manufacturer warranty report format with added fields that are specific to the installation process.

The adopted amendments require that the manufacturer and installation warranty report be submitted in a format specified by the Executive Officer. The warranty reports are approved to be submitted electronically as a Microsoft Excel (Excel) spreadsheet in the format provided in the attachments. The attachments to this mail-out contain the data definition files and the data input templates as required by ARB for submitting annual warranty reports. ARB recommends submittal of the electronic data on a compact disc.

Attachments 1 and 3 contain an overview of the data file structure required for electronic submittal and provide description of the data fields for the manufacturer's warranty report and installation warranty report, respectively. The database field name and the corresponding definition are provided in these documents.

Attachments 2 and 4 contain the manufacturer's warranty report and installer's warranty report data template, respectively. These templates, in their Excel format, are the warranty report information data input files that were developed for submittal to ARB. The warranty reports (Attachments 2 and 4) may be mailed to ARB on a compact disc or submitted via e-mail.

The warranty reports (Attachments 2 and 4), with the exception of warranty reports for fuel additives or alternative diesel fuels, locomotive applications, stationary applications, transport refrigeration units, rubber-tired gantry cranes, and marine applications, must be submitted to:

All warranty reports for systems utilizing any form of fuel additive or alternative diesel fuel, including any fuel additive or alternative diesel fuel intended for locomotives, must be submitted to:

ANNUAL WARRANTY REPORT FORMAT FOR INSTALLERS AND MANUFACTURERS OF DIESEL EMISSION CONTROL STRATEGIES

On October 1, 2013, amendments to the *Verification Procedure, Warranty and In-Use Compliance Requirements for In-Use Strategies to Control Emissions from Diesel Engines*, Title 13, California Code of Regulations, Sections 2700-2711 (Procedure) became effective, requiring manufacturers and installers of diesel emission control strategies (DECS) submit their annual warranty report in a format approved by the Air Resources Board (ARB). The purpose of this mail-out is to provide the electronic annual warranty report format for submittal to ARB.

Warranty reports have been required from the DECS manufacturers since the original adoption of the Procedure. The warranty reporting requirements were modified to clarify that all warranty claims must be submitted in the annual report and delineate whether the claims are valid warranty claims or denied claims. In addition, the adopted amendments require that authorized installers are identified in the manufacturer's warranty report.

Previously installers submitted their warranty information to the manufacturer, however, the adopted amendments require that installers begin submitting an installation warranty report directly to ARB. The installation warranty report follows the manufacturer warranty report format with added fields that are specific to the installation process.

Attachments 1 and 3 contain an overview of the data file structure and provide description of the data fields for the manufacturer's warranty report and installation warranty report, respectively. Attachments 2 and 4 contain the manufacturer's warranty report and installation warranty report data template, respectively. These are the warranty report information data input files, in Microsoft Excel format, to be used for submittal to ARB.

The Verification Procedure is used to evaluate diesel emission control strategies to determine if they obtain real and durable reductions of particulate matter and/or oxides of nitrogen thereby allowing them to be used as fleet rule compliance options. The Procedure requires device manufacturers and the authorized installers to provide yearly warranty reports in a format specified by ARB. Changes to these requirements became effective on October 1, 2013.
