PUBLIC WORKSHOP REGARDING PROPOSED MODIFICATIONS TO

THE EXHAUST EMISSION STANDARDS AND TEST PROCEDURES -

1985 AND SUBSEQUENT MODEL HEAVY-DUTY URBAN BUS ENGINES AND VEHICLES, THE FLEET RULE FOR TRANSIT

AGENCIES, AND THE ZERO-EMISSION BUS (ZEB) DEMONSTRATION

PROJECT

<u>Background</u>: In February 2000, the Air Resources Board (ARB or Board) adopted the fleet rule for public transit agencies and amended the exhaust emission standards for heavy-duty urban bus engines and vehicles (Title 13, California Code of Regulations (CCR), sections 1956.1-1956.4, as amended on October 24, 2002). This regulation is designed to achieve significant reductions in particulate matter (PM) and oxides of nitrogen (NOx) emissions through the implementation of a fleet rule and emission standards for new transit bus engines. This regulation also required transit agencies to meet specified criteria to demonstrate and purchase ZEBs.

Proposed modifications to these regulations would apply to all California transit agencies, including transit agencies that do not own any urban buses and currently are not subject to the fleet rule for transit agencies. Thus far, the ARB has held public workshops regarding the proposed changes in El Monte on April 3, 2003, and December 2, 2003, and in Sacramento on December 3, 2003. Comments from those workshops have been reviewed and, in some cases, incorporated into this proposal. Topics to be discussed at the workshop include the following proposals:

Urban Bus Engine Standards

- ♦ 2007 and beyond Urban Bus Engine Standard. Staff is proposing to change the current 2007 urban bus standard to harmonize with the 2007 heavy-duty diesel truck standard.
- ♦ Engine Standards for Diesel Hybrid-Electric Buses (HEB). Staff is proposing an NOx standard for Diesel HEBs of 1.8 grams per brake horsepower-hour (g/bhp-hr) NOx emission standard, to be introduced during 2004-2006 model-years. The PM standard would be 0.01 g/bhp-hr. Staff is not proposing any changes to the interim certification standards for HEBs.

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Fleet Rule for Transit Agencies

- ♦ Changes previously proposed for this rulemaking will be moved to another date except for the following:
- ♦ Sections 1956.2 and 1956.4 will be modified to require any transit agency that purchases a diesel HEB to make up the difference between the certified engine standard and the adopted standard of 0.5 g/bhp-hr NOx for 2004-2006 model year diesel urban bus engines. Transit agencies will have to submit reports to ARB documenting their required NOx reductions.

ZEB Regulation

Staff is proposing that the ZEB demonstration requirements be modified to reflect the state of development of zero-emission fuel cell bus technology. Currently, the demonstration projects are behind schedule and will not attain the required number of buses. Staff is proposing that the timelines for the current ZEB demonstration be extended by 30 months and that the requirement for the number of buses be modified to count buses that are re-equipped with upgraded fuel cells. An upgrade must consist of a significant reduction in cost or improvement in performance.

Related Regulation Development

This proposed rulemaking does not affect buses used in shuttle services provided by or for community colleges, universities, and tourism separate from public transit operations. ARB is, however, proposing a public agency fleets measure that would require these operators to reduce diesel PM emissions from their buses and other heavy-duty diesel vehicles.

Staff encourages comments regarding this proposal and would appreciate receiving written comments by April 2, 2004. Timely submittal of comments allows staff time to address comments before the proposed regulation order is submitted to the Board for consideration in June 2004.
