SUBJECT: PUBLIC WORKSHOP REGARDING PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO

THE CALIFORNIA EVALUATION PROCEDURES FOR NEW

AFTERMARKET CATALYTIC CONVERTERS AND THE AFTERMARKET

PARTS REGULATION

<u>Background</u>: California Vehicle Code sections 27156 and 38391 prohibit the sale, offer for sale, advertisement, or installation of any device which alters or modifies the original design or performance of any required motor vehicle pollution control device or system unless that device has been exempted by the Air Resources Board (ARB or the Board). New aftermarket catalytic converters will be exempted if they comply with the requirements of Title 13, California Code of Regulations (CCR) section 2222(h) and "California Evaluation Procedures for New Aftermarket Catalytic Converters" adopted on August 19, 1988, and the "Optional Evaluation Procedures for New Aftermarket Non-Original Equipment Catalytic Converters in Motor Vehicles Equipped With On-Board Diagnostic (OBD II) Systems" that went into effect December 2001. Catalytic converters that are replacement parts, i.e., new original equipment manufacturers' converters and other converters meeting the criteria of Title 13, CCR section 1900(b)(14)) do not require exemptions.

Proposed Adoption of Amendments to the Aftermarket Parts Regulation and the "California Evaluations Procedures for Catalytic Converters": ARB staff is developing proposed amendments to section 2222(h), which will be brought before the Board at a public hearing scheduled for September 2005. The proposed amendments would: require that aftermarket catalytic converters only be used on a vehicle outside the vehicle manufacturers' catalytic converter warranty period, detail enhanced certification application requirements to provide standardized formatting between catalytic converter manufacturers, and adopt the amended 2001 "Optional Evaluation Procedures for New Aftermarket Non-Original Equipment Catalytic Converters in Motor Vehicles Equipped With OBD II Systems" as the "California Evaluation Procedures for Catalytic Converters" incorporated in Title 13, Section 2222 (h).

California Environmental Protection Agency

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The proposed amended "California Evaluation Procedures for Catalytic Converters" would specify criteria intended to ensure that new aftermarket catalytic converters will have sufficiently high conversion efficiency to meet the vehicle emission standards for a minimum of 50,000 miles and will be compatible with the OBD II systems required by Title 13, CCR sections 1968.1 and 1968.2. The proposed amendments also include several changes to make it easier for catalyst installers to identify the correct catalyst to install as well as for Smog Check technicians/inspectors to identify improperly installed catalysts.

<u>Workshop</u>: The staff requests comments from industry in an effort to refine the proposed amendments in a manner that will allow for an efficient and effective regulation. ARB staff has scheduled a workshop to discuss its current position and proposals regarding these issues and obtain information to further formulate specific proposals prior to the release of the Staff Report and documents relating to the September 2005 Board Hearing.
