SUBJECT: ADVISORY ON 2007 COMPLIANCE DEADLINE

FLEET RULE FOR PUBLIC AGENCIES AND UTILITIES

The purpose of this advisory is to notify owners and operators of vehicles subject to the Fleet Rule for Public Agencies and Utilities that the Air Resources Board (ARB or the Board) has verified two new diesel emission control strategies to reduce diesel particulate matter (PM) from older on-road engines: the HUSS Umwelttechnik FS – MK system, verified November 2006, and the Cleaire Horizon, verified February 2007. Therefore, public agency and utility fleet owners and operators of Group 1 (1960 – 1987 model year (MY) engines) and Group 2 (1988 – 2002 MY engines) vehicles have technology available to meet the compliance schedule in Table 3, title 13, California Code of Regulations, section 2022.1(c). The compliance deadline for 20 percent best available control technology (BACT) on Group 1 and Group 2 engines is December 31, 2007. Fleet owners and operators are encouraged to contact manufacturers and/or authorized dealers as soon as possible to get more information on these devices.

## What if a verified device will not work on my vehicle?

If a control strategy is available, but has been determined incompatible with an engine/vehicle combination, the owner may apply for an individual vehicle extension provided that BACT has been applied to all other vehicles (within same Group) as required. Technical analysis and/or documentation from the device manufacturer must be provided with the request for a compliance extension, as well as the documentation of BACT implementation on remaining vehicles in same Group.

Compliance extension requests received by ARB after July 1, 2007, will be denied.
