SUBJECT: PUBLIC WORKSHOPS TO DISCUSS REVISIONS TO THE CARL MOYER PROGRAM GUIDELINES

Air Resources Board (ARB) staff invites you to participate in a series of public workshops to discuss upcoming revisions to the Carl Moyer Program Guidelines. The Carl Moyer Program provides incentive grants to reduce emissions from on-road and off-road motor vehicles and agricultural sources.

The Carl Moyer Program Guidelines provide local air quality management and air pollution control districts with a framework for administering the program and selecting grant applications. The ARB has revised the guidelines several times since they were first adopted in 1999. These proposed guideline revisions are scheduled to be presented to the Board at a public meeting in February 2008.

At the workshops, ARB staff will present draft project criteria for the source categories fundable under the Carl Moyer Program. Staff will also report on the progress of two work groups developing proposals for updated program administration requirements and for a new off-road fleet modernization (equipment replacement) project category. Staff will post draft concepts on ARB's web site
