SUBJECT: DRAFT PROPOSED TEST PROCEDURE MODIFICATIONS FOR SMALL OFF-ROAD ENGINES AND EQUIPMENT

The Air Resources Board (ARB) staff is planning to propose modifications to the California small off-road engine (SORE) regulations primarily to increase harmonization of the test procedures with the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency's (U.S. EPA) rules. Staff plans to accomplish this goal by sunsetting the current test procedures with the 2012 model year and adopting portions of U.S. EPA's Parts 1054 and 1065, of Title 40, Code of Federal Regulations (published on November 8, 2010). However California has specific goals that may differ from the needs of the rest of the country; therefore, some portions of Parts 1054 and 1065 have been either modified or excluded. For example, U.S. EPA and ARB have very different emission credit programs, so ARB has excluded portions of U.S. EPA's rules that refer to their credit program. The proposed modifications are scheduled to be considered for adoption at the December 2011 Board Hearing.

In addition to proposing adoption of these modifications, ARB staff is considering a proposal to change the SORE certification exhaust test fuel to a ten-percent ethanol blend (E10). This change is being considered so that the certification test fuel used for California's off-road gasoline-fueled engine and equipment categories remains consistent with the planned E10 changes to the on-road motor vehicle certification test fuel requirements. Please note that because ARB staff is only in the early stages of considering this modification, the attached documents do not specifically reflect this proposed change. Nevertheless, we are seeking comments from interested parties on this important issue.

Please review the draft proposed changes to the SORE test procedures. These changes are attached as modifications to the California Exhaust Emission Standards and Test Procedures for 2005 and Later Small Off-Road Engines, and Parts 1054 and 1065.
