TO THE TRUCK AND BUS REGULATION

The California Air Resources Board (ARB or Board) invites you to participate in a public workshop to discuss the proposed changes to the Carl Moyer Memorial Air Quality Standards Attainment (Carl Moyer) Program Guidelines herein referred to as the Guidelines. Staff will describe potential changes to the Guidelines to provide additional funding opportunities based on amendments to the Regulation to Reduce Emissions of Diesel Particulate Matter, Oxides of Nitrogen and Other Criteria Pollutants from In-Use Heavy-Duty Diesel-Fueled Vehicles (Truck and Bus Regulation), to be considered by the Board in April 2014, and to discuss some additional proposed changes to the general criteria.

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Background

Since 1998, the Carl Moyer Program has filled a critical niche in California's strategy to achieve clean air. The Carl Moyer Program provides grant funding for the incremental cost of cleaner-than-required engines, equipment, and emission reduction technologies. The Carl Moyer Program complements California's regulatory program by funding emission reductions that are surplus, i.e., early and/or in excess of what is required by regulation.

At its April 2014 hearing, ARB will consider for approval amendments to the Truck and Bus Regulation. The proposed amendments were published February 25, 2014. As currently proposed, the amendments will result in additional funding opportunities under the Carl Moyer Program for vehicles subject to the Truck and Bus Regulation. However, the Carl Moyer Guidelines will need to be updated to reflect these additional funding opportunities. The Board is scheduled to consider the proposed Guideline changes at the Board hearing in July 2014.
