SUBJECT: PUBLIC WORKSHOP TO DISCUSS THE PROPOSED ADVANCED

CLEAN TRUCKS REGULATION PROPOSAL INCLUDING MANDATORY

REPORTING FOR LARGER COMPANIES AND FLEETS

The California Air Resources Board (CARB) invites you to participate in a public workshop to discuss the development of the Advanced Clean Trucks (ACT) regulation proposal. Staff will be presenting updates to a regulatory concept that would require heavy-duty vehicle and chassis manufacturers to sell a portion of Class 2B and larger vehicles sales as zero-emission and would require mandatory reporting for larger companies and fleets.

The purpose of the proposal is to accelerate deployment of the first wave of zero-emission trucks in California through while helping achieve air quality, climate, and public health goals. The proposal will contribute towards the goal of achieving zero-emission pick-up and delivery services in urban areas by 2040. This effort is part of a broader strategy to support the transformation to a more efficient, economically competitive, and less polluting freight transport system.

Through this process, CARB staff is seeking to work in partnership with manufacturers, fleet owners, and other interested stakeholders to identify the most effective strategy to accelerate the deployment of zero-emission

technologies where they are suitable from now through 2030. Future regulations would look to continue advancing zero emission technology beyond 2030.

Staff will be seeking comments on an updated manufacturer sales schedule that initially targets the types of vehicles that are most suitable for electrification and sets the stage for widespread transportation electrification in all weight classes. Staff will also be seeking comments on the proposed reporting requirements for larger employers, motor carriers and fleets that operate in California, as well as public fleets, utilities, and companies that provide or contract for transportation services.

Background

Achieving California's long-term air quality, climate, and public health goals will require a transition from the conventional combustion technologies to zero-emission everywhere feasible and near-zero-emission powered by clean, low-carbon renewable fuels everywhere else. Promoting the development and use of zero-emission trucks will contribute to the goals set in the Sustainable Freight Action Plan and will help achieve emission reductions as outlined in the State Implementation Plan, Senate Bill (SB) 350 (de León, Chapter 547, Statutes of 2015), Assembly Bill 32 (Nuñez, Chapter 488, Statutes of 2006), and SB 32 (Pavley, Chapter 249, Statutes of 2016). This effort is part of a broader strategy to increase clean, affordable transportation options such as zero-emission technologies, innovative methods to improve goods movement, and efficiency of transportation systems in California.
