SUBJECT: NOTICE OF PROPOSED REGULATORY ACTION TO REQUIRE
MANDATORY REPORTING FOR LARGER COMPANIES ABOUT FREIGHT
AND OTHER TRANSPORTATION RELATED SERVICES

You may be affected by a proposed regulation that the California Air Resources Board (CARB) is developing to accelerate the use of zero emission trucks and buses in California. Large companies including retailers, wholesalers, manufacturers and government agencies may be required to report information about whether they contract for pick-up and delivery services, ship freight, or transport employees by shuttle. The information would be used to develop future regulations requiring the use of zero emission vehicle fleets. Please direct this notice to the appropriate person within your organization so that your comments can be considered.

CARB staff is conducting workshops on a proposed Advanced Clean Trucks regulation and is seeking to work in partnership with interested stakeholders to identify the most effective strategy to accelerate the deployment of zero-emission technologies in transportation. The proposed regulation would contribute towards the goal of achieving zero-emission pick-up and delivery services in urban areas by 2040. These efforts are part of a broader strategy to support the transformation to a more efficient, economically competitive, and less polluting freight transport system in California.
