Pursuant to the authority vested in the underigned by Health and Safety Code Sections 39515 and 39516 and Executive Order G-45-9;

IT IS ORDERED AND RESOLVED: That the engine and exhaust emission control system produced by Ryobi Outdoor Products in calendar year 1995 for use in utility and lawn and garden equipment are certified as described below:

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: That the Executive Officer has been provided all material required to demonstrate certification compliance with the Board's emission control system warranty regulations (Title 13, California Code of Regulations, Section 2405 et seq .).

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: That the listed engine models shall not be used in any non-hand-held type of utility and lawn and garden equipment.

Engines certified under this Executive Order must conform to all applicable California emission regulations.
